

NZ Budget Announcements

There were two announcements in this year's budget that are relevant to the sector.

Trades and Apprentices Training Package Announced in 2020 Budget

The Government has announced a \$1.6 billion Trades and Apprenticeships Training Package that will provide opportunities for New Zealanders of all ages to receive trades training. It will continue to be added to as part of our ongoing work to rebuild the economy. Read more

Workforce Development Councils

The Government recently announced a significant trades training package. As part of this, six Workforce Development Councils are being fast-tracked for establishment by the target date of October 2020. This is ahead of the original target of mid-2021, to help support New Zealand's COVID-19 recovery.
